**REQUIREMENTS FOR THE GLOBAL CLUB MANAGEMENT AND LEADERSHIP MAJOR**

*Effective Fall 2021*

**Admission Requirements:**

The Global Club Management and Leadership major is a limited access program. To be admitted to the major, students must (1) have completed at least 52 semester hours, (2) have completed HFT 1000, CGS 2100 or CGS 2518, ECO 2013 or ECO 2023, and MAC 1105 with a grade of “C-” or better in each course, (3) have an overall GPA of at least 2.50 on all prior college level work, and (4) successful completion of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> GE English and Math coursework. The overall GPA required is subject to change each academic year. **While some courses may be offered online, this major is an in-person only program and requires students to attend the main campus.**

**Lower-level Prerequisites:** All courses must be completed with a “C-” or better prior to admission to the major.

### **Additional Information:**

1. Global Club Management and Leadership majors must **complete 6 months of approved internship**. Internships must be approved by the Director of Global Club Management & Leadership, Cynthia Johnson ([crjohnson@dedman.fsu.edu](mailto:crjohnson@dedman.fsu.edu)).
2. Global Club Management and Leadership majors are required to complete a **Global Component** to include one of the following: International Internship, Study Abroad Experience with FSU International Programs, a Domestic Internship with a Multinational Corporation, or the completion of a Global Citizenship Certificate.
3. **Attendance and/or participation in a minimum of 6 industry events is required.** These may include but are not limited to: Club Managers Association of American (CMAA) National Student Conference, CMAA World Conference, PGA Merchandise Show, CMAA FSU Student Chapter Club Tour Events, and FSU Dedman College Leadership Summit.
4. Global Club Management and Leadership majors are required to be **members of the Club Management Association of America upon being formally admitted to major.**
5. Capstone Portfolio. Internship Documentation, CMAA Involvement, Industry Engagement and Activities, International Experience, Reflect Essay, Work Action Photos and Best Practices.
6. **In addition to the requirements outlined above, each student must complete all University-wide requirements for graduation.** These requirements include liberal studies requirements, the summer school requirement, the FSU residency requirement, and total hours requirements.
7. Students needing elective hours to satisfy the University 120 total hours requirement are encouraged to take additional courses from the list of hospitality electives that are taught in the Dedman College beyond the semester hours required.
8. Typically, core Hospitality Management courses are not offered in the Summer terms at the Main Campus. The Dedman College offers Summer Study Programs in Switzerland, London, and Italy through FSU International Programs.
9. Students must not enroll in any course at another institution without first receiving approval from the Dedman College. Once enrolled at FSU, students should plan to take their Hospitality courses at FSU. Any exception to this policy must be approved in advance by the Dedman College. Transfer of upper-level Hospitality courses completed prior to enrolling at FSU must be from other 4-year, accredited institutions. These courses must be approved for course substitution by the Dedman College upon entering FSU.
