The Panama Canal is an integral part of one of the largest supply chain routes in the world, making FSU Panama the perfect setting for students interested in this area of study. Students will have some coursework before and after going abroad for this one-credit hour course, and will travel to Panama with their professor and peers during spring break. Students on this program have the opportunity to learn about logistics, sourcing, quality control, transportation, and more through conversations with industry leaders. Students learn about the various links of the supply chain through class excursions such as a trip on the Panama Canal Train and port visits.

## Excursions & Group Activities

- Tour on Panama train into the Port of Colon visiting the canal and its locks

- Day trip to San Blas Islands
- Farewell dinner
